Updates from the MBBC President

WE'RE OFF AND RUNNING INTO 2013

The club accomplished a lot in 2012.

- A new club jersey was designed, manufactured and is now being worn by many of us.
- The club began a library of cycling-related material for members to borrow, and the library continues to grow as members contribute more items.
- The club acquired two hard shell bike travel cases, now available for members to check out when they need to box bikes for travel.
- The Bill's Hills Ride continued for its third year, attracting a larger contingent (though I would like some more women to join me)!
- The club provided bicycle escorts for the Bellingham Marathon and Half-Marathon and will continue to provide this service for the race in 2013.
- The MBBC donated 200 bike helmets to low-income children for Bike Month back in May.

We have plans for 2013, with the biggest new event being our **Ride Leader Certification Program**. We've been trying to get this started for a few years, and have been stalled due to lack of funding from community grants. But this year the board decided to just draw from our club funds to finance the Ride Leader Training. It is a club goal to get more people certified to lead rides, which should translate into more rides of varying levels, so that more people will get on their bikes and ride together within our community.

We will hold our first Ride Leader Certification training on March 21st from 6-9 pm. More details will be included in the March newsletter as well as on our Yahoo ListServ. Everyone is encouraged to participate, and to think about what kinds of rides you would like to see added (and that you'd like to lead) to our club schedule.

We will be prominently involved with everybodyBike's "Love Your Ride" celebration on February 10th. everybodyBike is working to have raffle prizes donated, and the MBBC will be the raffle beneficiary. Monies we receive from the raffle will allow us to again contribute bike helmets and gear to low-income children for Bike to Work and School Day. We hope you'll attend the celebration (see p. 3) and join the MBBC volunteers who will be there helping with the Bike Fashion Show and selling raffle tickets!

The club has some money in our Bob Lindquist Memorial Fund and we've discussed using it to purchase bike racks for a Bellingham school. With the talent in our club, we may have people who can volunteer some installation and labor help to stretch our money into providing more racks.

And we've been discussing a re-start of the old DUMB ride ("Down and Up Mt Baker"), perhaps in collaboration with a local bike shop. We hope for the roads to be open to Artist Point by August so we can plan the ride then!

We look forward to a great year and hope to see you at our events and on the road. Ride Safe and Often!

THE BIKE SHOP

update from Matt Velguth

Has it really been 3 years?

The Bike Shop is getting a new skin. Steel siding, provided by grants from The Dudley Foundation and Bellingham Bay Rotary, has worked its way around the exterior providing a respectable outside to match a formidable inside. You can imagine my feelings when I pulled into the parking lot on a Saturday morning in December to find graffiti running the 42 foot length of the Shop's front. I calmed myself down and called the police only to find out that one of our teen riders had already called. This same boy then arrived and volunteered to bike to Home Depot and pick up cleaning supplies. Six teens in all helped scrub off the graffiti, one making the unsolicited comment: "Hey, it's our Shop too!" Graffiti is a routine risk when working in troubled neighborhoods, but six teens teaming up to take it down is a rare and wonderful thing. The new siding escaped undamaged and I actually felt that we gained something for the experience.

2012 was a great year of growth for the Shop. Our ride miles nearly doubled largely due to both the growing activity of our older riders and to more riders than in previous years.

Community involvement at our twice-a-year Bike Swaps also grew, translating into more funding.
